

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING PROPOSED REDUCTIONS IN HEALTH SERVICES  
FISCAL YEAR 2005-2006**

The San Francisco Board of Supervisors will conduct a Beilenson Hearing pursuant to Section 1442.5 of the California Health and Safety Code (Beilenson Act) on the elimination and/or reduction of health care services to indigents provided by the City and County of San Francisco for fiscal year 2005-2006. The Beilenson Hearing will be held:

At this hearing, the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco will consider the impact of the proposed elimination and reduction of health services on the health care needs of the county's indigents. Public testimony, both oral and written, will be accepted at this hearing.

The San Francisco Department of Public Health has prepared the attached list of proposed budget reductions that are subject to Beilenson Hearing. The list includes the elimination and reduction of health services to the county's indigents. Although California Health and Safety Code Section 1442.5 does not require notice on the elimination and reduction of mental health and substance abuse services, the Department of Public Health has included these changes in its attached list.
